

Kristin needed a combined total of 42 units of blood related to two pregnancies years apart. She suffered an amniotic fluid embolism during her second pregnancy. That's when amniotic fluid gets into the bloodstream which is toxic for the mother. It took 26 units of blood to help save her life. In a subsequent pregnancy complication during the birth of her fourth child, Kristin received another 16 units of blood.
