

GOSPEL MEDITATION

March 2, 2025
8th Sunday of Ordinary Time
Luke 6:39-45

One of the things that older pastors and younger priests occasionally quarrel about is the proper balance between work and prayer. I know one pastor who complains that his younger associate ignores the people and the parish because he wants to spend more time in prayer. And the young priest complains that the pastor gives him too much work to do and no time to pray. The Lord's words this Sunday speak into this tension with an image that can help us find a proper balance between life and prayer.

Jesus says, "For every tree is known by its fruit. For people do not pick figs from thorn bushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles" (Luke 6:44). When we are deeply rooted and cultivating our relationship with Jesus, we are going to bear the fruit of that love in our lives. No fruit, no good prayer. How do we know that we are praying well? We are experiencing concrete fruits of love for others in our lives.

Someone who prays well will, sooner or later, burst forth the "figs" and "grapes" of acts of love. But without concrete commitment to deeds of selfless service to others, our prayer time is as useless as thorn bushes and brambles. Let's recommit ourselves to be men and women of prayer and service. And hopefully the pastors will help their associates to pray and serve fruitfully...with minimal quarreling.

SOUP & SANDWICH SUPPERS



SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Casimir

We live in a culture that tells children, "Follow your dreams! Be who you want to be!" It might be hard to imagine the courage it took to be St. Casimir. A prince second in line for the throne of Poland, the young man had great expectations placed upon him.



Inspired by a devout tutor, St. Casimir developed a deep faith. As a teenager, he would often sleep on the ground, reject courtly finery for plain clothes, and dedicate long hours to prayer. He even made a private commitment to celibacy. Casimir's avoidance of a military engagement made his father furious. The king imprisoned his own son. The episode confirmed to St. Casimir that he served a higher King, Jesus Christ. He would spend the rest of his life in prayer, study, and service to the poor. When we need courage to do what is right, St. Casimir, pray for us!

A NOTE FROM THE CHOIR LOFT

Music Director Paul Nason



Hello fellow parishioners,

As we move into Lent, you will undoubtedly notice some changes in the music for the season. The most obvious things are the lack of a Gloria (Glory to God) and the verse before the Gospel, as well as the lack of instrumental music. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states that "In Lent the playing of the organ and musical instruments is allowed only in order to support the singing. Exceptions, however, are Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), Solemnities, and Feasts." As we all give up things throughout Lent, we too must give up some of those musical comforts we grow accustomed to hearing. However, there are some other practices we will observe during this penitential season.

The first will be the use of chanted antiphons during the entrance and at the start of communion. This allows a simpler, meditative, and more accessible musical selection throughout the Mass. The words to the antiphon can be found along with the readings, and we will use the same psalm tones throughout the whole season. It will take some adjustments, but please consider lending your voice once you are familiar with the tune.

The second change will be our use of the chanted Latin Mass setting (Missa Jubilate Deo, pages 69-70) throughout the season. The Bismarck Diocesan Synod Manual states that "All parish congregations and schools should be familiar with the Ordinary parts of the Mass, in both English and Latin, as found in the Roman Missal and sing them some of the time throughout the Church Year." These are simple chanted parts that many of you may already know. For those who do not, please consider opening your hearts to the beauty of these words.

I thank you for your continued dedication and love to this parish, and I look forward to worshipping with you throughout this Lenten season.
