GOSPEL

March 23, 2025 3rd Sunday of Lent John 4:5-42

My childhood best friend was Xander Price.

He was the fastest runner in school, an excellent baseball player and Jewish. Though his family wasn't intensely religious, I felt totally at home with them despite our religious differences. Everything about their Judaism seemed to undergird and strengthen my own experience of being a Catholic. I knew they didn't believe in Jesus like my family did, but I intuited somehow that Jesus was "hiding" in their religion. Like a cat moving under a blanket, ready to emerge at any moment, the Lord was hidden there in a special way.

In the Gospel for this third Sunday of Lent, Jesus says, "For if you had believed Moses, you would have believed me, for he wrote of me" (John 5:46). Stunning words, those. Moses wrote about Jesus. The way therefore that we come to know and believe in Jesus is to discover him lurking in Moses' writings. The Hebrew Scripture is the wonderful womb in which Jesus gestates within a host of images: Adam, Isaac, David, Melchizedek, the Temple, sacrificed lambs, prophets and so on. Right now, in your parish's OCIA program, soon-to-be baptized people are carefully studying where Jesus is in the writings of Moses, so that they may believe in him. This works for all of us, too, who wish to deepen our knowledge and love of Jesus.

Lenten challenge: Take some time to prayerfully study one of the images of Jesus listed above in the Old Testament. Identify which one you find compelling and consider why this is so. If you don't know where to start, begin with the prophet Jeremiah as an image of Jesus.



ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT OUR LADY OF GRACE MARCH 27TH

Are you in need of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick? You are invited to Mass with Anointing on Thursday, March 27th, 9 a.m., at Our Lady of Grace.

For who? The sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is a wonderful experience of healing and strengthening for Baptized Catholics above the age of reason. It should not be looked at as something that is to be celebrated only right before death but for anyone who is elderly, has a serious health condition, is having surgery, or whose health has or is deteriorating. Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present. One must decide with reasonable prudence and be prepared to receive the sacrament by celebrating reconciliation beforehand, so that one is in a state of grace at the reception of the sacrament.

What does the Sacrament do? Our God through his church wants to show his compassion and offers us his grace in this beautiful sacrament of healing and strength. This sacrament gives the grace of the Holy Spirit to those who are sick: and by this grace the whole person is helped and saved, sustained by trust in God, and strengthened against the temptations of the Evil One and against anxiety over death.

It is important to also see that many times the healing that occurs is not physical but spiritual and relational, which Christ and the Church tells us is even more important than physical healing. This sacrament is to be seen as a consecration of one's life to God not only in good times but even in difficult times. It is offering our pain and difficulty to God that we may share in his salvific suffering. If we do not give God the permission to use our sufferings from illness or old age for his plan of salvation, it is simply suffering, He will not force His way upon us. But on the other hand if we offer it to Him to use, it becomes a source of salvation for us and others.

How is the Sacrament administered? In the sacrament there is the laying on of hands, anointing with oil, and prayer for the person. A person, with their illness, is invited to consecrate their life to God, through a spiritual offering, sharing with him their suffering, and to receive his healing power.

For this Mass on March 27th there will be a number of concelebrating priests, and opportunity for confession from 8:30-8:50 am.
