It gives us the knowledge and tools to recognize concerns, understand appropriate boundaries, and respond responsibly when situations arise. Most importantly, it demonstrates that we take seriously the trust that our parish, families, and community place in us.

Please do not put off completing your forms. **If you have outstanding paperwork or training requirements, please take care of them as soon as possible.** We need everyone's cooperation so that we can complete our Safe Environment requirements and continue serving our parish and community in the right way.

Thank you for everything you do for the Knights of Columbus. I appreciate your commitment, your fellowship, and your willingness to serve. Let's make this new breakfast season a great one, continue growing together through COR, and make Safe Environment a priority in everything we do.
